New displays in the Resource Center feature the set of 5 History of Oakley Banners



Agriculture in Brentwood is highlighted on Banners of recorded stories of farming families and on boards displaying local crate labels.



















Footprints in the Sand by Kathy Leighton covers history of all ECC communities. (Price \$30)




ECCHS has been busy sharing their love for local history at many festivals. Here are some places we have been:

Christmas on the Farm ~ Looking to 2024

Our wonderful family event held in 2021 was loved by all who attended. Due to heavy rains last year, the event was cancelled at the last minute ~ Not so much because of rain on the day itself, but because of mud in the field used for parking.

DISAPPOINTING NEWS is that ECCHS board made the difficult decision to not plan Christmas on the Farm for 2023.

But the GOOD NEWS is that we DO plan to once again hold Christmas on the Farm in 2024 and continue it as an annual event!

We have made this decision because we do not want to have to possibly cancel at the last minute again. AND the land next to us, including the parking orchard, is being developed by Harvest Time. We anticipate that with this development, the parking issue will be resolved by 2024!

ECCHS is excited about the Agriculture Innovation Center to be built by Harvest Time on the property surrounding Museum grounds. This center is focused on youth, agriculture education, and nonprofit organizations in our farming community.



Breakers Update

Two major donations and a major restoration project underway will soon vastly elevate the quality of the outdoor displays at the museum.

The Heidorn water wagon has been sitting behind Homer's shed since 1993, and weather has taken an enormous toll on it. Watching the wooden structure crumble and the large tank rust has led to the decision to resurrect this unique piece of history.

The tank was carefully removed utilizing a forklift. The deck of the wagon was so badly rotted that it was totally removed with very little need for hand tools. The underlying frame is quite solid, but the wheels are fragile.





An amazingly well-preserved seeding wagon owned by the Cakebread family has been donated to the museum. It is in remarkable condition and is still sporting its' original paint with a wonderful patina from years of hard work.

As icing on the cake we are now the proud owners of two vintage gas pumps: A 1914 12' tall visible gas pump which for years was in the office of Frank Byer in his office at his gas station.

And a Union 76 gas pump from circa 1960's.


Our Museum has welcomed 412 visitors during Open Hours this summer! An increase of 157 visitors over last year and we still have 2 Saturdays to go!
