Looking to 2025

ECCHS has made great strides toward *Bringing Local History to Life!* through growth and expansion of projects and activities in 2024.

Over 6,500 volunteer hours* dedicated to our museum this past year resulted in many gains toward ECCHS goals:

- The museum shifted its open hours to earlier in the day and doubled hours open time to 4 hours. Museum welcomed **483 visitors** in 2024.
- Membership gained 40 new members including 4 business members
- A **Members Night at the Museum** hosted 160 attendees to honor Ron & Shirley Nunn for their gift of land for museum expansion
- **Opening Day** and **Christmas on the Farm** were reinstated and welcomed many museum visitors (*Opening Day* ~300 COTF ~ 1,000)
- ECCHS participated in **12 community events** (7 in 2022, 10 in 2023)
- 1,617 third graders, 400⁺ parents participated in Local History Days
- ECCHS partnered with City of Brentwood to create interpretive panels to commemorate history of Davis Camp at the site as we 'take history into the community'



- Resource Center welcomed local residents
 and organizations researching community and results
- Board position of Community Director was redefined to **Community Ambassador** to focus on outreach and engagement in ALL communities.

*The 6,500 Volunteer hours were logged by 13 Breakers, 43 Docents, 8 Resource Center Workers, 6 Greeters, and 13 Board Members.

This does not even include the hundreds of hours volunteered by members at events or to chair projects! Our resolution for 2025 is to include THOSE hours!

How would you like to work from the comfort of your home, on your own time and not have to come to the museum to volunteer?



If you have ever wandered the grounds of the Museum, you will have noticed an old façade along the south fence. At one time, this façade disguised the end of the original resource center, which was a mobile home between the back of the house and the restrooms. It was moved near the school house over ten years ago when the Kathy Leighton Resource Center was built.

ECCHS has been setting aside money for years to build an enclosed structure to house and display these vehicles. With saved monies augmented by a generous donation from Ken Grundsted, a Vehicle Barn is now in our immediate future!



Bids have been received on construction of a large (40'x60') barn to house the majority of the wagons and buggies currently in the open pole barn west of Homer's Shed.

These wagons and buggies will find a new home soon along with displays that give the history of wheeled transportation.

In preparation, Breakers are hard at work moving equipment and old lumber to clear the construction area.

East Contra Costa Historical Society works hand-in-hand with Brentwood, Byron, Knightsen, and Oakley School Districts to enhance study of local history for all third grade students. Children tour the museum to learn about the rich history of their local community in the morning, followed by lunch under the Pole Barn.

In the afternoon, that history is brought to life through hands-on activities when students step back into the late 1800's to experience a day in school, play games and do chores of the time period.

1,600 students plus 400 parents participate in the Local History Days at the ECCHS Museum annually. Many report that it is the best field trip ever!

Frank Davis delighted ECCHS members at the November Member Dinner with stories about the impact of Davis Camp on the many families who came to California for work and a better life.


"There were jobs here. They called us 'fruit tramps', but that's OK because it instilled work ethic in us that has built part of this country."
